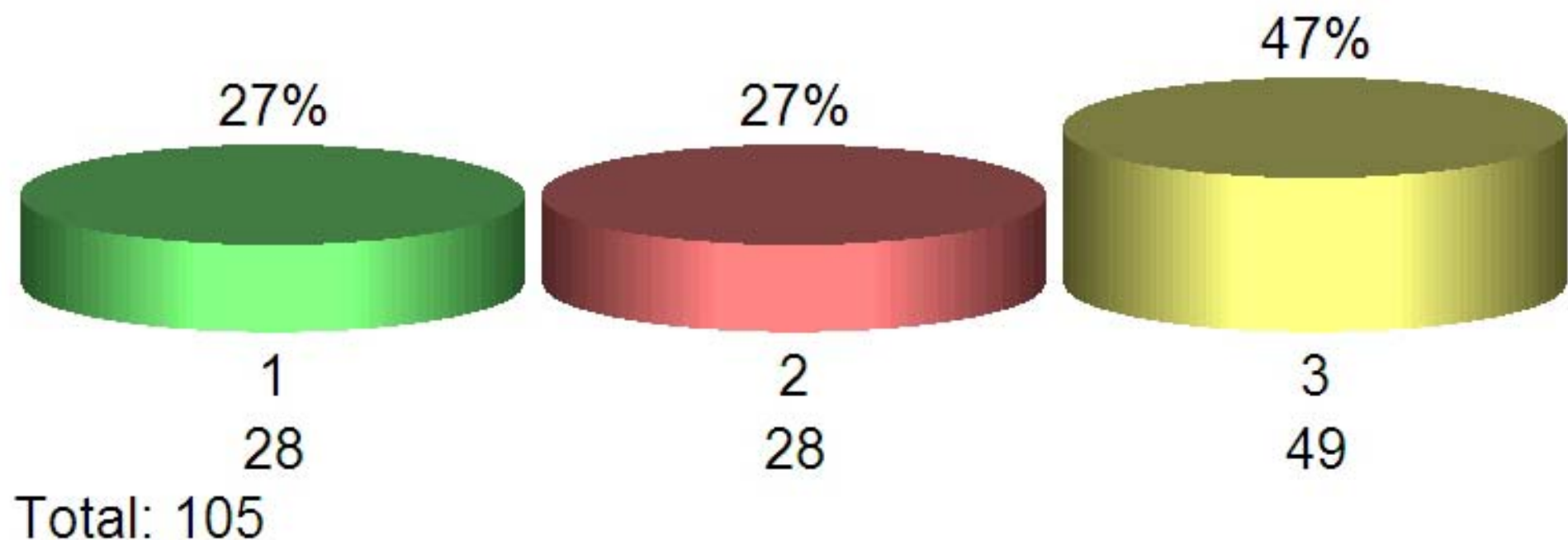

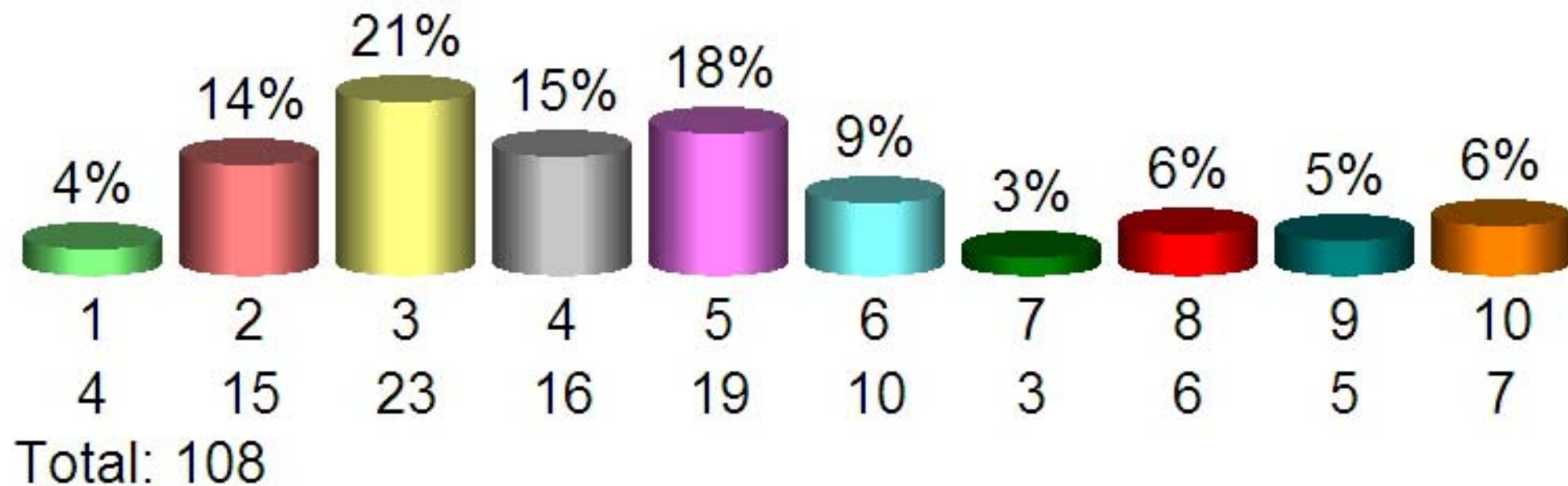

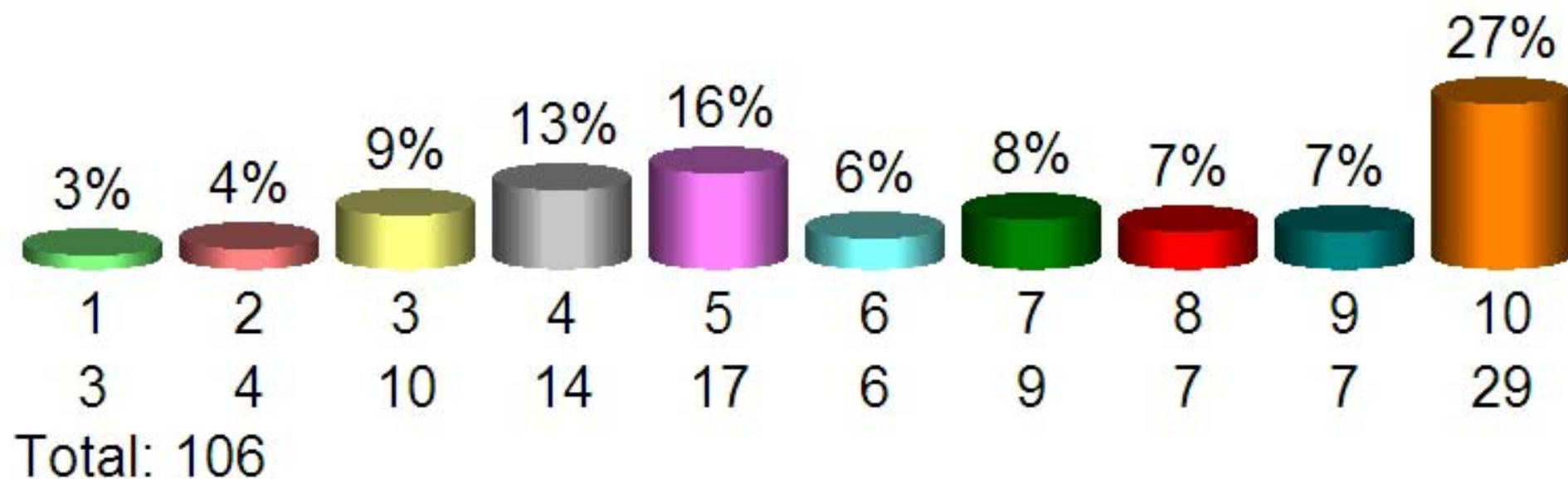

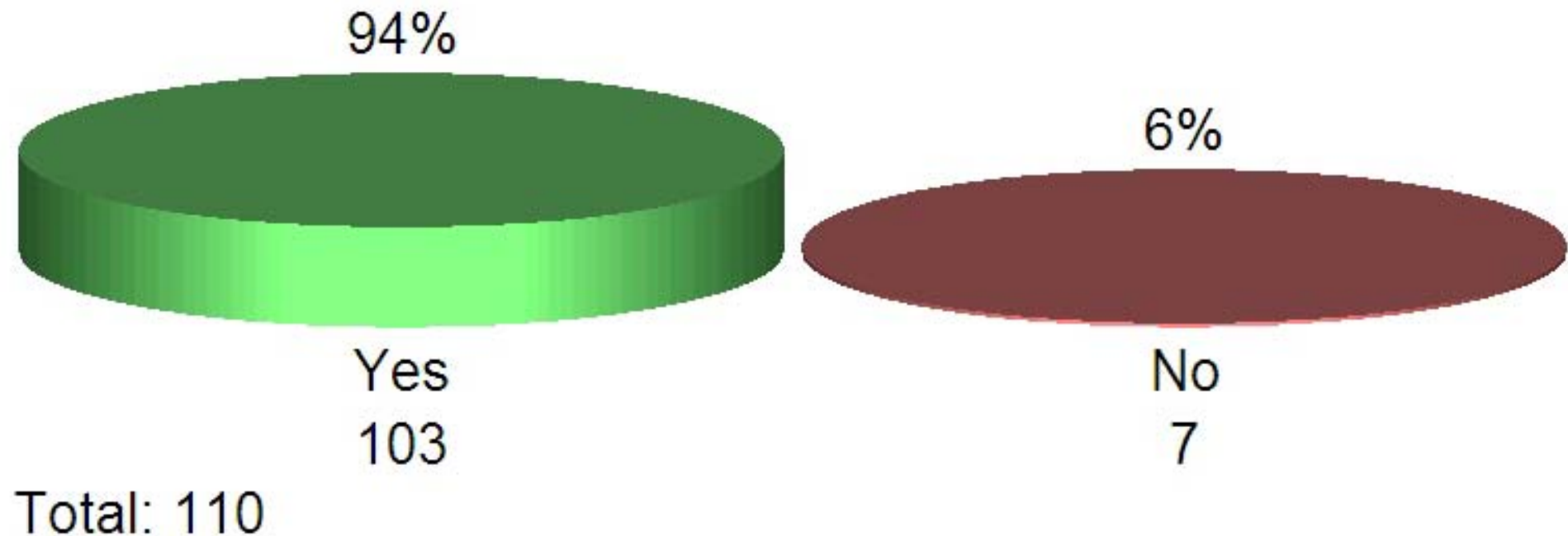
Does your hospital utilize clinical pharmacists on any inpatient settings?

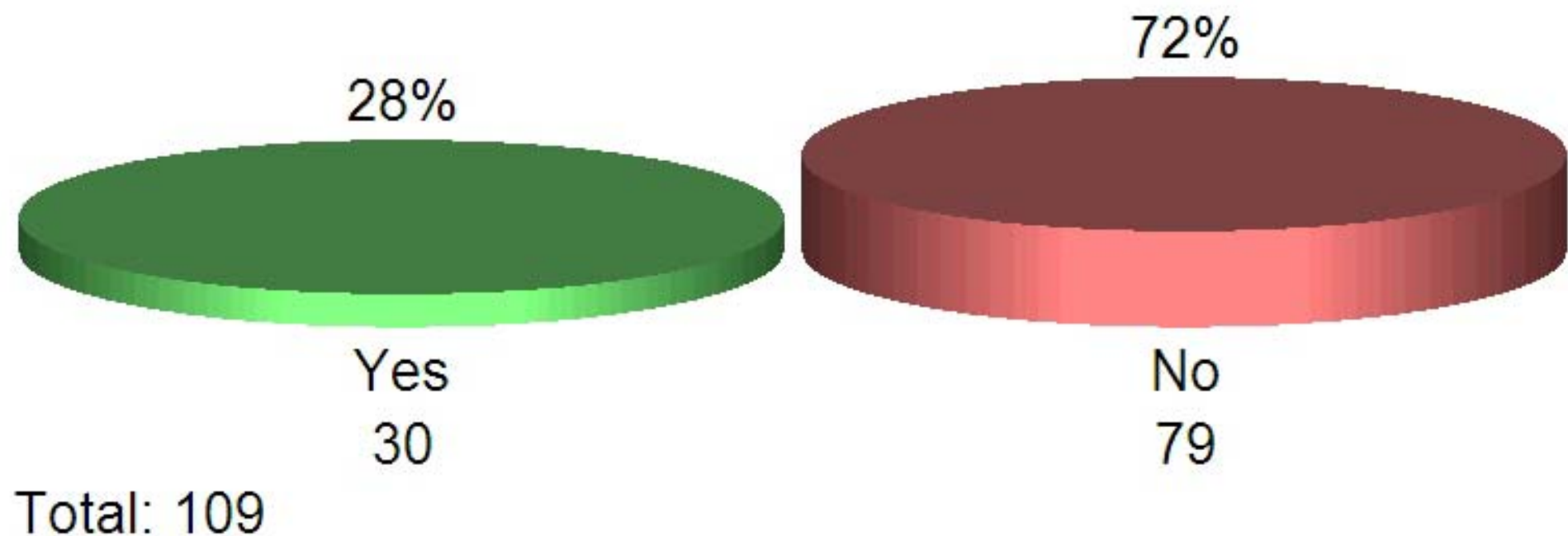
Does your hospital utilize clinical pharmacists in any ICUs?

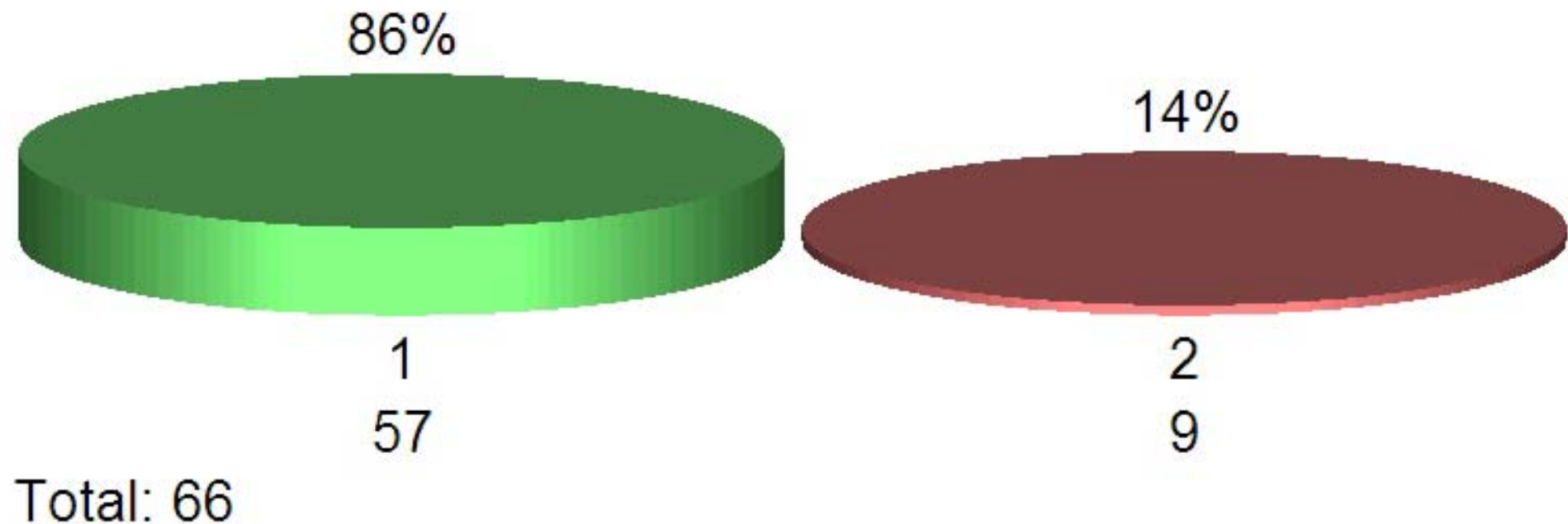

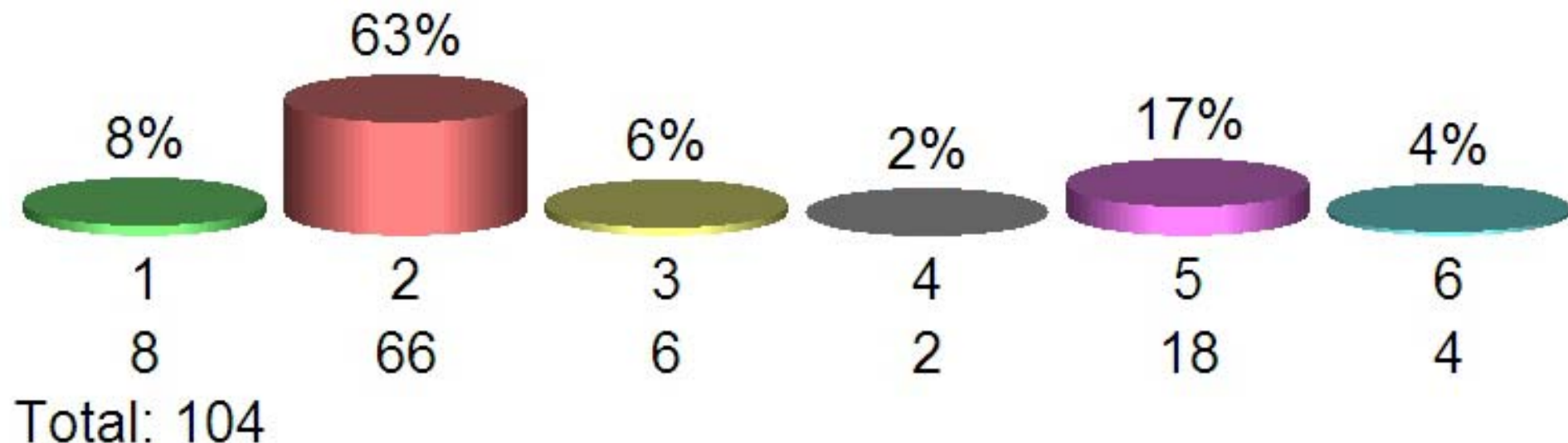

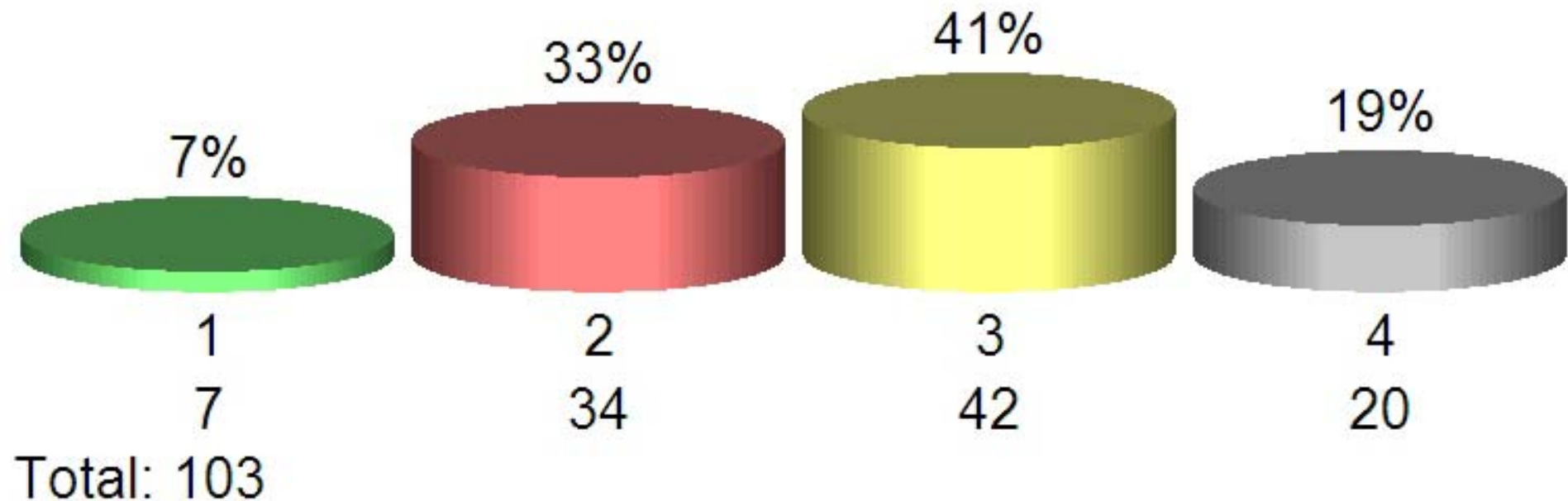

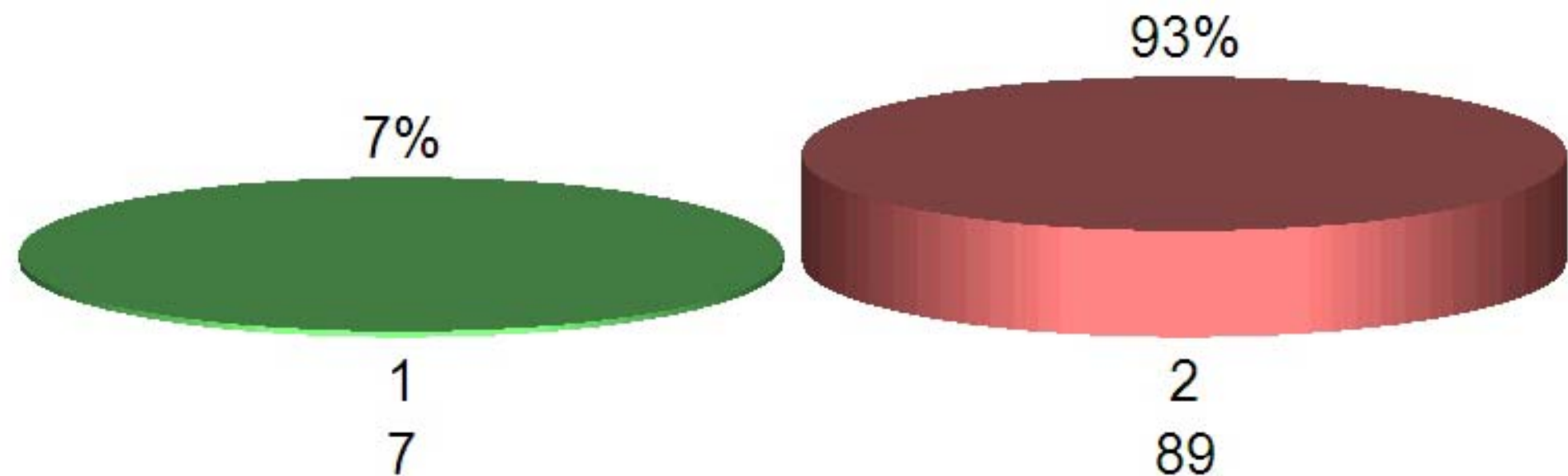
